History

Hispanic Heritage Month recognizes the contributions of Hispanic Americans in the United States and celebrates Hispanic heritage and culture. The observation started in 1968 as Hispanic Heritage Week under President Lyndon Johnson and was expanded by President Ronald Reagan in 1988 to cover a 30-day period starting on September 15 and ending on October 15. It was enacted into law on August 17, 1988.

September 15 was chosen as the starting point for the celebration because it is the anniversary of independence of five Latin American countries: Costa Rica, El Salvador, Guatemala, Honduras and Nicaragua. They all declared independence in 1821.

Citizens of Hispanic descent have lived in the City of Buffalo and WNY area since the late 1800's, immigrating from Mexico, Cuba, regions in South and Central America, and the Caribbean including Puerto Rico. This growing population has made significant contributions to the WNY area and continues to be a flourishing part of the community.
