Three Kings Day celebrations set

The Hispanic Heritage Council of Western New York invites everyone to celebrate the Hispanic tradition called El Dia De Los Tres Reyes Magos — or Three Kings Day.

The custom dates back to the early 16th century and is celebrated 12 days after Christmas to commemorate the biblical story of Melchior, Gaspar and Balthazar, the three kings who visited Jesus after his birth bearing gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh.

On Jan. 5 in many Latin American countries, children prepare boxes filled with hay to represent the manger baby Jesus lay in. The boxes are placed under the youngsters' beds, and the next morning, they wake up to find three gifts in their boxes that represent the three gifts that were given to baby Jesus.

The observance also is called the Feast of the Epiphany.

Three Kings Day will be celebrated at a variety of venues this weekend and next, the Hispanic Heritage Council announced. The celebration often includes gifts for children in the community.

At 7:30 p.m. Friday, One World Tribe, a music and dancing show that includes funk, Latin and world beat sounds featuring performers from Africa, Jamaica and Puerto Rico, will headline the celebration in Albright-Knox Art Gallery, 1285 Elmwood Ave.
