Experses, as established by an act of the United States Congress, each year Hispanic Heritage Month is celebrated nationwide from September 15th to October 15th, with September 15th marking the anniversary of declared independence for five Latin American countries: Costa Rica, El Salvador, Guatemala, Honduras, and Nicaragua, followed by the anniversary of Mexico's declared independence on September 16th and Chile's on September 18th; and

Experses, during this month-long observance of Hispanic heritage, members of our State's Hispanic-American communities celebrate their distinctiveness and help reinforce the Empire State's reputation as a cultural capital of the world, as all New Yorkers are inspired to participate in our state's proud and longstanding tradition of expressing appreciation for the history, customs and goodwill of its many communities; and

Thereas, it is fitting that all New Yorkers join in this celebration of cultural pride and tradition, and pay tribute to the contributions our Hispanic communities have made and continue to make to all facets of life in this great state and nation;
